Hello,

There are three billion people in the world under the age of 30. Many are eager to make a difference, including as peacebuilders. The gap between aspiration and reality lies in a lack of access to support for peace education. That's one conclusion of the United Nations report *The Missing Peace: Independent Progress Study on Youth, Peace and Security.* The report drew on input from 4,000 young people and research across 44 countries.

In 2014, NewGen PeacebuildersSM launched with a mission to *"make learning to be a peacebuilder a rite of passage for everyone."* The motto is ...

Build Pence. Repeat the Pence.

In the subsequent eight years, thousands of young people ages 14 to 24 have become certified peacebuilders after completing learning journeys and developing peace projects.

In 2021, a new and exciting initiative called Youth & Peace in Action (YPA) was introduced. YPA, powered by NewGen Peacebuilders, integrates live, virtual education, training and mentoring with an Online Peace Platform.

Research shows that teaching peace in classrooms and providing education, training, and mentoring in extra-curricular settings – including supporting peace project experiences in student clubs – is essential to build cultures of peace. YPA make it easy for educators and students to:

- Understand drivers of conflict and peace
- Imagine innovative solutions to create change
- Build bridges for the rest of their lives

Overview

YPA is the largest youth peacebuilding initiative in the US and Caribbean. It's supported by an innovative online peace education platform with two interactive programs.

The "Leading Peace Project Teams" live, virtual training experience is available to Interact and other clubs through sponsorship of \$500 per youth-led project. A related "My Peacebuilder Foundations" online certification accompanied by a teacher toolkit is distributed to schools at no cost. Teachers, club advisors, and Rotarians who are familiar with the content are VERY positive in their feedback.

Benefits for Students, Teachers, Communities

Access to Peacebuilding Frameworks and Tools

Through YPA, teachers and students learn to use established frameworks to consider how power, conflict, violence, and peace intersect. Among these are four well-known tools for conflict resolution, peacebuilding, and project development: Galtung's Triangle of Violence to distinguish different types of violence; 5 Spheres of Peace to examine right relationships; Eight Pillars of Peace to understand systemic drivers of conflict and peace; and the UNLEASH Innovation Process.

Certification and Service Hours

Students who complete the My Peacebuilder Foundations online course receive certification as NewGen Peacebuilders. Students who complete the Leading Peace Project Teams training and mentoring experience also learn management skills and receive additional certification. Educators in schools and clubs that participate in YPA can access Professional Development opportunities and certification.

Awards and Recognition

YPA alumni become part of a network of young peacebuilders with access to additional academic and internship opportunities. Many have received local, national, and international awards, recognition, and scholarships. Participating schools, clubs and organizations are recognized in a year-end YOUnited celebration. Select peace project teams are profiled, and YPA Peace Educators of the Year are announced.

Impactful Peace Projects

Students come to understand the root causes and visible effects of conflict in their communities and develop peace projects to address issues in one or more of 10 categories.























General FAQs

Who can sign up for YPA? Who has content access once a school or club signs up?


Any high school in the United States and certain parts of the southern Caribbean can sign up for Youth & Peace in Action (YPA). In 2023-24, the My Peacebuilder Foundations (MPF) online course is available at no cost (Free) for up to 1,000 high schools thanks to sponsorship support provided to YPA. When a high school principal, teacher, or club advisor signs up for MPF, the online course content and related classroom discussion materials are available to any teachers and interested students in the school. Leading Peace Project Teams (LPPT) from YPA trains and mentors students inInteract and other youth clubs to imagine, design, and develop peace projects. Training and support for each project is \$500. This can be funded by a school, youth club, or Rotary Club. The YPA team helps coordinate sponsorship requests.

What organization is behind Youth & Peace in Action (YPA)?

YPA is a peace education, training, and mentoring initiative powered by US-headquartered nonprofit NewGen Peacebuilders (NGP), which was established in 2014. In the nine years since, NGP has certified more than 6,000 young peacebuilders, primarily at the high school and university levels. YPA is an expansion that provides an Online Peace Platform with certifications, a guide and online toolkit for teachers and club advisers with materials that can be used in a classroom setting, and Professional Development opportunities. YPA officially launched in 2021 with sponsorship from Districts and Clubs in Rotary Zones 33 & 34, and collaboration from the Alliance for Peacebuilding and the Institute for Economics & Peace.

What experience does YPA have working with schools, teachers, and student clubs?

YPA builds on NewGen Peacebuilders (NGP) experiences bringing peace education, training, mentoring, and professional development to schools, teachers, and student clubs since 2014. From September 2021 through June 2022, YPA has or



YPA has an advisory council of administrators, teachers, and student ambassadors who provide continuous feedback on improvements, new curriculum, and training needs. This is supplemented with survey-based monitoring and evaluation tools used by YPA.

Does a school need District or other school system approval to participate in YPA?

Generally, speaking, no. The My Peacebuilder Foundations (MPF) online course is not presented as official curricular content. MPF is considered supplemental education for which a principal and or teachers can choose to add and use to strengthen student learning and classroom activities. The Leading Peace Project Teams (LPPT) experience is an online content, training, and mentoring experience that club advisors and students can choose to participate in when they decide it supports club learning, service, and project goals.

What is the value and benefit of NewGen Peacebuilders certification?

The My Peacebuilder Foundations online course and certification within YPA is available at no cost (free) for up to 1,000 high schools. The cost of \$500 for each Leading Peace Projects Team experience is often funded by local community sponsors. The benefits for teachers, students, and communities include: access to peacebuilding frameworks and tools; certification and service hours for students; awards and recognition for students, teachers, and club advisors; and impactful peace project ideas and implementation in communities. MPF and LPPT certifications can be listed on resumes, CVs, and university/college applications. Many certified peacebuilders qualify for further awards, scholarships, and internships.







Summary

In the My Peacebuilder Foundations (MPF) course students explore definitions of peace, come to understand key drivers of conflict and peace, and envision the role of young people in creating peaceful and resilient communities.

Assessments after each module ensure that students who complete the course receive a certificate from NewGen Peacebuilders and Youth & Peace in Action. Estimated course completion time is 10 hours.

7H Framework


The course is delivered through a series of online modules that leverage the NewGen Peacebuilders 7H Framework. Each module takes 60-90 minutes to complete, and is divided into sections that can be completed in 30 minutes or less (ideal for class settings).

Every module involves Self-Reflection activities, Gaining New Knowledge, and Interactive Exercises.

The course's interactive tools include Padlets, Mentimeters, matching and sort card knowledge checks, tips and reflections from YPA alumni guides, and peace project case studies.









7H Framework: Fundamentals of Power, Conflict, Violence and Peace

Students reflect on their beliefs and values related to peacebuilding, and the difference young people can make in school, communities, and the broader world. Assessments are included at the end of each module and after completion of all modules.

2 Hope	 Reflections on whether the world has become more peaceful Distinctions between service and peace projects as a process for positive change
3 Harm	Broad perspectives on what constitutes "harm"
4 Healing	 Connections between universal ideals of human rights and peace
5 Heart	 Distinctions between pity, sympathy, empathy, altruism and compassion Essential "ways of being" including active listening, focusing, self-awareness, and emotional management
6 Head	 Personal "triggers" that get in the way of peacebuilding Indexes of global peace, positive peace, human development, happiness, and more

Leading Peace Project Teams (LPPT)






Summary

Leading Peace Project Teams (LPPT) from YPA trains and mentors students in Interact and other youth clubs to imagine, design, and develop peace projects. An online catalogue features 50+ inspiring youth-led peace projects.

From 1 to 10 students in an Interact or other youth club can register to create a project.

LPPT includes a short online introduction to peace project fundamentals and a live interactive virtual training experience. Coaches/mentors provide feedback on peace project ideas. Students who complete LPPT become certified NewGen PeacebuildersSM and often qualify for service hours, awards, recognition, and scholarships.





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Materials to Support MPF In-Classroom Activities, Conversations

The My Peacebuilder Foundations online content is designed so that individual students can sign up, complete the course independently in approximately 10 hours, and become certified. However, many teachers have expressed that they would like students to complete the course in a group or class guided by the teacher. Also, teachers have noted the relevance of YPA to a variety of subjects including English, Social Studies/US History, World Languages,

Leadership Academies, and Social and Emotional Learning (SEL). To help, the YPA Online Peace Platform Toolkit provides a variety of materials for use by teachers, including:

- Course-at-a-Glance
- Content Crosswalks
- Slides
- Downloadable Activity Guides (PDFs)
- Suggested Class Activities and Discussion Prompts
- Downloadable "Manipulatives" for Hands-on Exercises
- Social Media Graphics and Videos

The MPF course and accompanying Toolkit resources are *Free* for all students and teachers in 1,000 high schools.
